Top Ten

Can you research the top ten of different geographical features; Try the top ten tallest mountains or the ten longest rivers. How many different categories can you think of?

Can you make a map of where you live? Think about the things around you that need to go on your map. Can you use symbols to represent certain features?

Map Reading

Choose two countries from different continents and use the internet to find out things that they have in common and what they have that is different.

Create

Using playdough can you create a model of the Earth? Remember the core, the outer core, the inner core and the crust. Remember your land and seas.
