

# How can you support your child's History learning at home?

At Junction Farm, we encourage our children to enjoy sharing their learning with their families and carers. Our half-termly project activity grid in the Information Booklet contains tasks to consolidate the history learning that has taken place at school.

If you would like to support your child's history learning at home, there are a number of different activities and websites

## Play Dress Up

Children will be able to connect with history and also act out famous scenes they are learning about at school. This is a creative way for your child to learn about how historical figures lived.

## Reading

Visit the historical fiction section of your local library to discover the vast range of stories available that can transport your children into the history they will be learning about in schools.

## Visit Historical Places

Seeing history in this environment makes it more real. In museums, children can explore artefacts from the past, including clothing, tools, and other artefacts.

## Play

Use toys at home to teach your child about the history behind them. This way you are using items your child already loves as learning tools!

## Discuss Current Events

Watching Newsround on CBBC and discuss current world topics. Allow your child to ask questions.

## Quiz

Create a family quiz about something in history. You could create different rounds like a picture round and a famous quotes. Then play as a family.

## Use Media

Be on alert for television shows/movies which are accessible to children and focus on historical/social issues.

## Family History

Help history come alive by reviewing old photo albums or create a family tree. Children could talk to grandparents about their experiences.
